## **Multiple Scholarships Open to Hart County Students through Scholarship Central**

**ELIZABETHTOWN, KY** (January 23, 2020) – Central Kentucky Community Foundation has thousands of dollars in scholarships for the 2020-2021 academic year available through Scholarship Central.

Scholarship applications are now being accepted through Scholarship Central, CKCF's easy-to-use online scholarship portal at [ckcf4people.org](http://ckcf4people.org). Using just one application, students can apply for more than \$400,000 and 200 scholarships available to award. Students have from now until midnight EST, Sunday, March 1 to apply.

Scholarship Central is user-friendly and allows high school seniors, current and future Elizabethtown Community and Technical College students in CKCF's nine-county service region to apply for multiple scholarships based on eligibility. Students input basic information once and then customize details for specific scholarships.

The following scholarships are available to Hart County students:

### **Owen J. Estes, Sr. Memorial Scholarship**

Students graduating from Hart County High School with a cumulative 2.5 GPA are eligible to apply for the Owen J. Estes, Sr. Memorial Scholarship. The recipient may pursue any academic or vocational field of study at any in-state public institution.

Owen J. Estes, Sr., spent his life teaching students in Hart County. His career as a math teacher touched an untold number of lives forever. To honor his father's work in education, Paul Estes established a scholarship fund for Hart County High School graduates.

### **Hardin County Cattlemen's Association Wayne G. Overall, Jr. Memorial Scholarship**

This \$1,000 award from the Hardin County Cattlemen's association is for any high school graduating senior who plans to attend a university or technical school in Kentucky and is a member of the Hardin County Cattlemen's Association or the Kentucky Junior Cattlemen's Association.

### **Mike and Sharon Bell Scholarship**

Graduating seniors who are a current Hardin County Water District No. 2 customer or an active member of Glendale Christian Church for at least five years \$1,000 award are eligible for this scholarship.



### **Elizabethtown Community and Technical College Scholarships**

All of ECTC's scholarships are available on Scholarship Central. The scholarships vary in amounts and are available to new and returning ECTC students.

### **Dr. Jim Owen Memorial Scholarship**

The Dr. Jim Owen Memorial Scholarship was established by Nancy Lea Owen to honor the memory of her husband, Dr. Jim Owen. He served as the first President of Elizabethtown Community College. He had a love for learning and books as well as community service.

### **Dr. Linda Mayhew STEM Scholarship**

The Dr. Linda Mayhew STEM Scholarship honors the legacy in STEM education created at ECTC by Dr. Mayhew. She was the first faculty member hired at the college and taught for 52 years. Applying students should have cumulative 3.0 GPA and plan to attend ECTC in a STEM related field of study.

### **Gourmand's International Culinary Scholarship**

The Gourmands International Culinary Scholarship is open to Culinary Arts students at ECTC.

Students planning to attend ECTC pursuing any academic or vocational field of study are eligible to apply. These scholarships are available to new and returning ECTC students, including adults returning to college.

Scholarships available through Scholarship Central are generous gifts from numerous donors over many years. Scholarships vary in amount and eligibility criteria. Collectively they represent a wide range of qualifications to reach students at many levels of academic achievement, community and school involvement, and financial situations.
