Local scholarships available for college students through Scholarship Central

ELIZABETHTOWN, KY (January 23, 2020) – Central Kentucky Community Foundation has thousands of dollars in scholarships for the 2020-2021 academic year available through Scholarship Central.

Scholarship applications are now being accepted through Scholarship Central, CKCF's easy-to-use online scholarship portal at ckcf4people.org. Using just one application, students can apply for more than \$400,000 and 200 scholarships available to award. Students have from now until midnight EST, Sunday, March 1 to apply.

Scholarship Central is user-friendly and allows high school seniors, current and future Elizabethtown Community and Technical College students in CKCF's nine-county service region to apply for multiple scholarships based on eligibility. Students input basic information once and then customize details for specific scholarships.

Some of these scholarships are available to college students, including several for students who plan to attend ECTC.

Some of the scholarships available to college students include:

Col. Larry and Betty Sue French Scholarship \$500 award to a Hardin County student attending or planning to attend Western Kentucky University Elizabethtown Campus.

Dennis and Lisa Parrett Family Scholarship \$1,000 award to a graduate of a high school in Hardin County and enrolled as a sophomore, junior or senior at the University of Kentucky College of Agriculture, Food and Environment.

Hardin County Cattlemen's Association Hansell G. Pile, Sr. Memorial Scholarship \$1,000 for college student attending a Kentucky university or technical school and is a member of the Hardin County Cattlemen's Association or the Kentucky Junior Cattlemen's Association.
