

We thought it would be an improved experience for everyone in the process -- applicants, reviewers, school personnel. It has also led to phenomenal growth in available scholarships in this region. In 2013, the year before we launched Scholarship Central, we awarded \$58,000 in scholarships to 30 students from 6 scholarship funds. In 2017, we have over \$110,000 available from 21 funds. Heels Together awards 2 grants

In November, Heels Together investors selected the funding recipients for the second year of Heels Together grants.

The top grant winner was **Passages Transitional Housing**, a component of Communicare, to provide resources and support to women who have completed residential drug treatment and striving to become self-sufficient. The grant will help reduce barriers regarding employment and help them transition to independent living. Chamie Markey was the presenter.

We are fortunate to have enough funding to fund a second grant this year. **Hardin County Schools** was the second award winner. **The Sit with Me** event and mentorship program strives to reduce the gender gaps in the computer science and tech industry by guiding and supporting our young female students, growing them into visionaries, innovators, communicators and strong, positive leaders in their community, state and world. New scholarships added to Scholarship Central in 2017

Three new scholarships are part of Scholarship Central to award to students in Spring 2017. These scholarships bring the total scholarship funds administered through **Scholarship Central** to 21, with many awarding to multiple students.

The **Trooper Ponder Memorial Scholarship** was established in memory of Trooper Cameron Ponder, a Kentucky State Trooper who was killed in the line of duty. The scholarship will award to multiple students in Hardin County with priority given to students from a military family or who plan to pursue a law enforcement career.

The **Gourmands International Culinary Scholarship** is open to students enrolled in the Culinary program at ECTC.

The **Dennis and Lisa Parrett Family Scholarship** is for a local student studying in a degree program offered through the University of Kentucky College of Agriculture, Food and Environment.
