Dow Corning funds Vex Robotics Team

The Dow Corning Fund of Central Kentucky Community Foundation awarded \$5,000 to the EC3 Vex Robotics Team. The Vex Robotics Team encompasses students from all Hardin County District high schools. Neagle described the program as one that "seeks to increase student interest and

involvement in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) by engaging students in hands-on sustainable and affordable curriculum-based robotics engineering programs across the U.S. and internationally."

The Dow Corning Fund was established as a way to support the local communities where they have operations. One area of focus is to help schools enhance their STEM education programs.
